Breckenridge Kicks Off the Holidays Dec. 6 with the Lighting of Breckenridge, Race of the Santas and New Search and Rescue Canine-Led Holiday Dog Parade

BRECKENRIDGE, Colo. - Nov. 11, 2025 - Celebrate the magic of the season in Breckenridge on Saturday, Dec. 6, 2025, with the town's most beloved holiday tradition, the Lighting of Breckenridge and the Race of the Santas. This year's celebration shines even brighter as Summit County Search and Rescue's heroic canines take the lead in the Holiday Dog Parade, kicking off a day filled with wagging tails, racing Santas, and twinkling holiday lights.

This Hallmark-esque celebration offers fun for all ages—including furry friends! The festivities begin with the beloved holiday dog parade, open to all breeds, followed by Bernerfest at Continental Divide Winery and the new Jingle Paws Runway dog fashion show with Breck Create. Kids can join the Moose March fun run (first 150 registrants receive a moose beanie), and the Race of the Santas highlights holiday-themed outfits and playful spirit, plus a Santa Dance Off. Festive attire is encouraged all day long. Race proceeds benefit the Carriage House Early Learning Center, Breckenridge's oldest childcare facility.

After the sun sets behind the Tenmile Range, Santa will lead the countdown to the Lighting of Breckenridge, illuminating the town with more than 250,000 dazzling LED lights (equivalent to 11.2 miles of lights) that give Breckenridge its signature snow-globe glow all winter long. This year, to comply with Breckenridge's new Certified Dark Sky Community ordinances, lights will turn off nightly at 11 p.m. along Highway 9, and at 2 a.m. within town limits.

Throughout the day, guests can embrace the spirit of giving at the Adopt an Angel holiday gift drive in Blue River Plaza. New this year, Breck Create's Campus Crawl features gingerbread house decorating, a snowman-building contest, an outdoor Ice Bar serving up mocktails, and an ice sculpture garden by current artist-in-residence Jodi Stuart.
