Last month, Breckenridge was officially designated a Certified Dark Sky Community by DarkSky International, making it the first resort town in Colorado to receive this prestigious recognition. This milestone opens new opportunities for stargazing, guided night tours and unforgettable winter experiences under the stars.

With five peaks, an award-winning dining scene, a deep commitment to sustainability encouraging visitors to "B Like Breckenridge," and a community that celebrates both its rich history and outdoor recreation, Breckenridge offers adventures for every style of traveler. This season brings several milestone anniversaries, culinary debuts, new ways to connect with nature after dark, and winter experiences for every ability level.

<u>Signature Events Shine Bright</u> — When the first snow falls in Breckenridge, it's impossible not to smile and feel the excitement of the season ahead. From racing Santas and a NEW snowboarding event to sculpting snow into art, Breckenridge spends the season channeling that childlike thrill into celebrations that make winter unforgettable.

- The Lighting of Breckenridge and Race of the Santas (Dec. 6, 2025): Hundreds of santas racing down Main Street is a spirited way to kick off the holiday season.
 Festivities abound throughout town including the Holiday Dog Parade, Handmade Holiday Market, and a meet-and-greet with Santa Claus.
- The 62nd Annual Ullr Fest (Dec. 18-20, 2025): Grab your Viking helmet, fur coat, and brightest onesie for Breckenridge's ultimate winter party. Honoring the early days of the Breckenridge Ski Resort, Ullr Fest kicks off the ski season with a world-record Shotski® attempt, a lively parade, the crowning of the Ullr King and Queen and a roaring bonfire dance party—the perfect place for everyone to practice their best snow dance.
- NEW Rockstar Energy Open (Dec. 19-21): Breckenridge Ski Resort and Rockstar Energy™ will debut the NEW Rockstar Energy Open snowboarding event, featuring world-class competitions, live music, art and an interactive fan village. sculptures that wow spectators before melting back into the winter landscape.

B Like Breckenridge Story - The 35th annual International Snow Sculpture Championships in Breckenridge will feature exciting firsts and fresh talent, including debut teams from Ukraine and Malta, a new South Korean team led by a trailblazing female captain, and Italy's all–first responder crew hailing from the same Alpine town where the competition's snowmaking equipment is made. Look out for Lithuania's innovative approach using custom-built tools and Team India, which trains in remote Himalayan winters and includes a deaf artist whose work transcends words.

Culinary Adventures Worth the Climb — At 9,600 feet, Breckenridge's elevated dining scene matches the altitude with bold flavors, inventive concepts and experiences worth traveling for. Opening late 2025, Forage Breckenridge will offer a 12-course tasting journey from acclaimed Chef Ryan Cook—whose experience includes earning a MICHELIN star at Winteringham Fields in the U.K.—blending Colorado-sourced ingredients with storytelling rooted in local art, history and nature. The award-winning Breckenridge Distillery adds to its inventive lineup with the debut of Mock One, a signature zero-proof cocktail as well as Casa Breck Tequila, while the family-run La Française Bistrot celebrates Chef Yvan Heraud's appointment as Colorado Delegate for the prestigious Disciples D'Escoffier. New flavors arrive this winter with Shifty Lifty - a new après-ski bar with craft sandwiches, just steps from the gondola, Breckenridge Coffee House serving up Breckenridge Coffee Roasters in a cozy cafe, Bar Down Tavern at Grand Lodge on Peak 7, as well as El Perro Negro's Mexican inspired cocktail bar and Rotolo's Craft & Crust both coming soon to Main Street. James Beard Award-winning chef Matt Vawter continues to elevate Breckenridge's culinary scene with standout seasonal menus at Rootstalk and Radicato.

B Like Breckenridge Story - Breck is cutting down on single-use plastics. Thanks to a 2024 town ordinance, restaurants now provide to-go serviceware and condiments *by request only*, and items like plastic water bottles, Styrofoam containers, cups, and single-use plastic utensils are off the table.

Femme-Owned Shops Make Their Mark on Main Street — Breckenridge's retail scene continues to evolve with a fresh wave of locally owned and women-led concepts. Newcomers include Midsommar Hat Co., DonLo Mercantile, and Baretto 1931 espresso bar - under the creative direction of local entrepreneur Nicole Shepherd. Other exciting arrivals include women-owned boutiques like Mode Boutique, Alyth Active, SPICYHEART Jewelry and Art Studio, Wandering Daisy (now under new ownership with a romance-novel twist), and Marybgoround, known for its hand-dyed tie-dye and artistic spirit. Those looking to support femme-centered organizations in fitness and wellness can take a class at Meta Yoga Studios, learn backcountry basics and avalanche awareness with VNTRbirds, find personal alignment through various modalities during a mini retreat at Clairvergence and explore the benefits of sound healing at Spirit Alchemy.

B Like Breckenridge Story - While you're browsing Breck's downtown shops, you'll notice sustainability woven into daily life. Single-use bags cost 25 cents to encourage reusable options, and the sale of single-use plastic water bottles is banned—so BYO bag and water bottle to take advantage of refill stations all over town.

Meanwhile, the arts community flourishes: Breck Create expands programming into wellness and movement with offerings like Alchemy Flow and Sound Journeys, alongside hands-on workshops in stained glass, weaving and sustainable design. At the heart of this is Breck Create's **Precious Plastics initiative**, which transforms local plastic waste into art, gear and keepsakes. Founded by Gene Dayton, who also built and runs the <u>Breckenridge Nordic Center</u>, the BOEC provides adaptive, year-round recreation programs for people with disabilities, from vision and hearing impairments to physical and mental disabilities.
- Summit Huts Association is expanding access to its beloved backcountry cabins by shifting from a lottery system to an internally managed, first-come, first-served booking process—welcoming both new and returning guests to Francie's Cabin, Sisters Cabin, Ken's Cabin and Section House in Breckenridge. The winter season calendar opens September 1 (summer opens May 1), making it easier than ever for more people to enjoy these iconic alpine escapes.
- Colorado Mountain College Breckenridge invites food lovers to "travel the world with their palates" through its expanded recreational culinary program, offering dozens of weekly classes—from Bangkok on Foot to Magical Spice of India to Bavarian Cuisine—with rolling registration available year-round.
- Welcome to Winter:
 - NEW Intro to Ice Climbing: Experience a full day of guided ice climbing in Breckenridge with <u>Colorado Adventure Guides</u>—perfect for beginners looking to learn the ropes in a fun, supportive environment, with all technical gear included.
 - Breckenridge Nordic Center: Snowcat tours around Breckenridge Nordic Center, accessible for all ages and abilities. History, Arts & Culture

- 2026 will mark the 20th anniversary of Breckenridge History, the nonprofit dedicated to
 interpreting and preserving the town's history as a mining town, as well as the eras that
 preceded and followed. NEW, the organization just announced that it was selected to
 exhibit the Smithsonian's Americans exhibit from January 17 through March 15, 2026, a
 coveted opportunity and testament to the work of Breckenridge History.
- When the bicentennial took place in 1976, Breckenridge was a special place to be. The Spirit of (19)76 exhibit, presented by **Breckenridge History in** spring 2026, shows moments in time that capture that lively atmosphere. From historical photos to memorabilia, this exhibit will bring you back to a different era.
- In January 2026, Breckenridge History is proud to host the Americans exhibit at the Welcome Center Museum. Based on a major exhibition at the Smithsonian's National Museum of the American Indian in Washington, DC, Americans explores how deeply intertwined American Indians are in the culture of the United States.
- Following the 150th anniversary of the Edwin Carter Museum, Breckenridge History
 is thrilled to reimagine Carter's story through new exhibits. Improved accessibility and
 interactive spaces for children will bring the museum to life. Dig into the story of land and
 wildlife and how different groups have used both through history.
- Frosted Flamingo Mobile Art Studio now has a NEW physical location on Airport Road.
- Breck Create is expanding fall and winter programming with a deeper focus on wellness
 and the intersection of art and movement. New offerings like Alchemy Flow (a blend of
 yoga, dance and creative movement), Sound Journeys, and Ecstatic Dance classes
 invite the community to embrace art in more immersive, restorative ways—often set
 within exhibition spaces.
- **Breck Creat**e is introducing new workshops that explore mediums such as Mountain Sun Catchers Intro to Stained Glass, Sashiko Mending: Japanese Embroidery, and Modern Geometric Weaving, while continuing to offer core programming like ceramics, painting and glass blowing, as well as family and youth crafting workshops.

 workshops in Spanish and English—such as Sashiko Mending: Japanese Embroidery,

- Breck Create continues to weave creativity into beloved Breckenridge traditions with hands-on opportunities like the Create Your Own Shotski workshop where participants use a mold made from recycled plastics in the Precious Plastics Studio, and Ullr-themed fashion design using upcycled textiles, as well as the Handmade Holiday Market during the Lighting of Breck.
- The innovative Precious Plastics initiative is also evolving, bringing in professional artists to elevate their use of recycled plastics through 3D printing, sculpture and exploring public art installation opportunities—pushing the boundaries of sustainable creativity.

- NEW Breckenridge has officially been designated as a Certified Dark Sky Community by DarkSky International—the first mountain ski resort community in Colorado to achieve this recognition. The designation underscores the Town's long-standing commitment to environmental stewardship, sustainable tourism, and preserving its iconic alpine nightscape for future generations.
- NEW, the Town of Breckenridge, State of Colorado, and Mountain Towns 2030 will host the <u>2025 Climate Solutions Summit</u> in Breckenridge, October 7-8, 2025. The two-day Summit will drive forward emissions-reducing solutions for mountain communities.
- At Breck Create, the <u>Precious Plastic initiative</u> comes to life through its Mix
 Workspace, where community members and visitors can turn plastic waste into art.
 Located on the Arts District Campus, the team collects clean, label-free #2, #5, and #6
 plastics from local businesses and residents. The plastics are shredded and sorted, then

<u>Sustainability On and Off the Slopes -</u> This winter, ski free of single-use plastics at Breckenridge Ski Resort. seven NEW electric buses on its routes over the next four years, which will bring its fleet up to 75% electric.
