



Breckenridge Oktoberfest Celebrates 30 Years on Historic Main Street, Sept. 25–27, 2026

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Breckenridge, Colo. – Aug. 13, 2026 - Breckenridge Oktoberfest will celebrate its 30th year on Historic Main Street September 25 - 27, 2026. The anniversary event will be the town's biggest and most dynamic event to date, with an expanded lineup of food offerings, authentic German beer alongside non-alcoholic options, the largest free Kid's Zone yet, and live music all weekend long. The milestone celebration lands during Breckenridge's peak fall foliage window.

What's New for the 30th Anniversary

- **Return of Authentic German Beer on Draft:** Festivalgoers can enjoy traditional German beers on draft from renowned breweries including Schneider, Köstritzer, Benediktiner, and König. The festival will also offer wine and introduce new Spaghett tents serving the popular beer cocktail made with German Pilsner, Aperol, and a touch of lemon juice, for a light and refreshing twist.
- **Outer Range Beer Garden:** The Breckenridge Creative Arts District along Washington Avenue will host a Bavarian-inspired beer garden that highlights local craft brewery Outer Range Brewing Co. in the heart of downtown.
- **Expanded Food & Culinary Options:** The festival welcomes 40 food vendors, including eight new offerings and 10 local Breckenridge and Summit County businesses. Foot-long sausages, giant turkey legs and Bavarian pretzels return, with a stronger lineup of international cuisines ranging from Greek, Brazilian, Filipino, and Argentine offerings.
- **Beyond Beer:** While this event celebrates beer, this year's festival also embraces the growing demand for alcohol-free beverages. Best Day Brewing N/A beers will be available at all beer tents along with kombucha from Summit Cultures and craft non-alcoholic cocktails available at the south end of the event near the kids zone.
- **Bavarian Style & Tradition:** For the first time, authentic handmade German dirndls (traditional Bavarian dresses), handmade flower crowns (blumenkranz), gingerbread hearts (lebkuchenherzen) and 2026 pins will be available for purchase. Authentic German-made 30th anniversary steins are available for both [advance purchase](#) and on-site. Dress your best to enjoy the highest Oktoberfest in the West!
- **Bigger Kid's Zone:** The Free Kid's Zone returns larger than ever, spanning the entire 400 block of Main Street, featuring inflatable attractions, face painting and family-friendly activities adjacent to the South Stage.

A Perfect Fall Getaway

Oktoberfest coincides with peak fall foliage in Breckenridge, when golden aspens turn mountainsides bright orange and yellow. Pair the festival with hiking, bike riding, scenic drives, horse-drawn wagon rides to a pumpkin patch or fly-fishing on the Blue River. Free guided foliage hikes with local naturalists, educational and ethical mushroom-[foraging hikes](#), and historic ["Golden Horseshoe" tours](#) give visitors more ways to explore fall's vibrant palette.
